Below are the five most popular routes.



The **French Way**, connecting Saint Jean de Pied de Port to Santiago, is the most important and popular route of the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage. It consists of 37 stages, covering a total of 940 km. This route has the deepest historical roots of the Camino de Santiago. It begins in France and crosses the Iberian Peninsula from east to west, entering Galicia via the legendary ascent to O Cebreiro. It is the quintessential Camino route, traditionally traveled by pilgrims from all over Europe

The **Northern Way** is as ancient as the French Way. It spans 815 km over 32 stages. Starting in Irún, pilgrims will cross the Asturian-Galician coast, facing challenges such as weather conditions and uneven terrain along the way, entering Galician soil in Ribadeo.





The **Primitive Way** is the oldest Camino de Santiago route, though its distance is much shorter than other routes. Starting in Oviedo and passing through towns like A Fonsagrada, it is now a route of great beauty and challenging terrain, with fewer crowds, following in the footsteps of the first pilgrim. It consists of 13 stages, totaling 321 km.

The **Portuguese Way**, starting in Lisbon, crosses Portugal from south to north, crossing the Miño River to enter Galicia through Tui, reaching Santiago after 25 stages and 620 km.



Finally, we come to one of the most popular routes: the **English Way**. This path is less crowded, well-marked, but with somewhat fewer services and accommodations compared to other routes. The English Way has two variations: one starting in A Coruña with 6 stages and 121 km, and another from the town of Ferrol, adding an additional stage of 33 km.

PORTUGUESE WAY FROM TUI

TUI | O PORRIÑO | REDONDELA | PONTEVEDRA | CALDAS DE REIS | PADRÓN | SANTIAGO

This route enters Galicia through Portuguese territory, covering a distance of 119 kilometers that can be comfortably completed in 6 days. It has become one of the most popular options after the French Way from Sarria.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN TUI (SELF-ARRANGED)

Accommodation in a 3 or 4-star hotel.

DAY 2: TUI - O PORRIÑA SEGMENT | 18.7 km

Breakfast at the 3 or 4-star hotel in Tui, followed by the segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in O Porriño.

DAY 3: O PORRIÑO - REDONDELA SEGMENT | 15.2 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in O Porriño, followed by the segment and accommodation in charming apartments in Redondela.

DAY 4: REDONDELA - PONTEVEDRA SEGMENT | 18.2 km

Breakfast at the charming apartments in Redondela, followed by the segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in central Pontevedra.

DAY 5: PONTEVEDRA - CALDAS DE REIS SEGMENT | 23.0 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in Pontevedra, followed by the segment and accommodation in a spa in Caldas de Reis.

DAY 6: CALDAS DE REIS - PADRÓN SEGMENT | 18.5 km

Breakfast at the spa in Caldas de Reis, followed by the segment and accommodation in a 2-star hotel in Padrón.

DAY 7: PADRÓN - SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA SEGMENT | 25.2 km

Breakfast at the 2-star hotel in Padrón, followed by the segment and accommodation in a 3 or 4-star hotel in central Santiago de Compostela.



ENGLISH WAY FROM FERROL



FERROL | NEDA | PONTEDEUME | BETANZOS | HOSPITAL DE BRUMA | SIGÜEIRO | SANTIAGO

This route was primarily used for medieval pilgrimages by the English (including those from Northern Europe and the Baltic regions) who arrived at the ports of A Coruña and Ferrol and then continued on this path to Santiago. Today, it is one of the most pleasant and solitary routes.

Accommodation in a 4-star hotel in the center of town.

DAY 2: FERROL - NEDA SEGMENT | 15.0 km

Breakfast at the 4-star hotel in Ferrol, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star manor in Neda.

DAY 3: NEDA - PONTEDEUME SEGMENT | 16.0 km

Breakfast at the 3-star manor in Neda, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a charming rural house in Pontedeume.

Day 4: PONTEDEUME - BETANZOS SEGMENT | 21.0 km

Breakfast at the charming rural house in Pontedeume, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in Betanzos.

Day 5: BETANZOS - HOSPITAL DE BRUMA SEGMENT | 28.3 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in Betanzos, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 1-star hotel in Hospital de Bruma.

Day 6: HOSPITAL DE BRUMA - SIGÜEIRO SEGMENT | 24.8 km

Breakfast at the 1-star hotel in Hospital de Bruma, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in Sigüeiro.

Day 7: SIGÜEIRO - SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA SEGMENT | 16.5 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in Sigüeiro, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star or 4-star hotel in central Santiago de Compostela.



FRENCH WAY FROM SARRIA

The French Way is the quintessential Camino route, where most European pilgrimage paths converge. It is the most popular among pilgrims, celebrated for its extraordinary historical landmarks and stunning scenery.

Accommodation in a 4-star hotel in the town center.

DAY 2: SARRIA - PORTOMARÍN SEGMENT | 22.4 km

Breakfast at the 4-star hotel in Sarria, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star inn in Portomarín.

DAY 3: PORTOMARÍN - PALAS DE REI SEGMENT | 25.0 km

Breakfast at the 3-star inn in Portomarín, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a charming manor in Palas de Rei.

DAY 4: PALAS DE REI - ARZÚA SEGMENT | 28.8 km

Breakfast at the charming manor in Palas de Rei, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in Arzúa.

DAY 5: ARZÚA - O PEDROUZO SEGMENT | 19.1 km

Breakfast at the rural house in Arzúa, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in O Pedrouzo.

DAY 6: O PEDROUZO - SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA SEGMENT | 20.0 km

Breakfast at the rural house in O Pedrouzo, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star or 4-star hotel in central Santiago de Compostela.



NORTHERN WAY FROM RIBADEO



RIBADEO | LOURENZÁ | ABADÍN | VILALBA | BAAMONDE | SOBRADO DOS MONXES | ARZÚA | PEDROUZO | SANTIAGO

The Northern Way is more than a local coastal path for Asturians and riverside communities. Following a medieval route, it has become an international Camino de Santiago path, leading pilgrims to the sanctuaries of Oviedo and Santiago de Compostela. Though it may not be as frequently traveled as the French Way, it possesses a unique and vibrant character.



THE JOURNEY

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN RIBADEO (SELF-ARRANGED)

Accommodation in a 3-star colonial house in the town center.

DAY 2: RIBADEO - LOURENZÁ SEGMENT | 29.5 km

Breakfast at the hotel in Ribadeo, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in Lourenzá.

DAY 3: LOURENZÁ - ABADÍN SEGMENT | 24.8 km

Breakfast at the rural house in Lourenzá, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 2-star inn and restaurant in Abadín.

DAY 4: ABADÍN - VILALBA SEGMENT | 20.6 km

Breakfast at the inn and restaurant in Abadín, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in Vilalba.

DAY 5: VILALBA - BAAMONDE SEGMENT | 20.7 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in Vilalba, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a hostel in Baamonde.

DAY 6: BAAMONDE - SOBRADO DOS MONXES SEGMENT | 40.3 km

Breakfast at the hostel in Baamonde, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 2-star hotel in Sobrado dos Monxes.

DAY 7: SOBRADO DOS MONXES - ARZÚA SEGMENT | 21.5 km

Breakfast at the 2-star hotel in Sobrado dos Monxes, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in Arzúa.

DAY 8: ARZÚA - O PEDROUZO SEGMENT | 21.5 km

Breakfast at the rural house in Arzúa, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in O Pedrouzo.

DAY 9: O PEDROUZO - SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA SEGMENT | 20.0 km

Breakfast at the rural house in O Pedrouzo, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star or 4-star hotel in central Santiago de Compostela.




FINISTERRE WAY FROM SANTIAGO

The Finisterre Way can be considered an extension of the French Way. It is the only route that begins in Santiago de Compostela and ends in Fisterra or Muxía, once thought to be the location of the end of the world. Today, it is one of the routes that is gaining more popularity among pilgrims.

Accommodation in a 3-star or 4-star hotel.

DAY 2: SANTIAGO - NEGREIRA SEGMENT | 21.0 km

Breakfast at the 3-star or 4-star hotel in Santiago, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in Negreira.

DAY 3: NEGREIRA - OLVEIROA SEGMENT | 33.4 km

Breakfast at the rural house in Negreira, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a rural house in Olveiroa.

DAY 4: OLVEIROA - FISTERRA SEGMENT | 34.9 km

Breakfast at the rural house in Olveiroa, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a 3-star hotel in Fisterra.

DAY 5: FISTERRA - MUXÍA SEGMENT | 29.3 km

Breakfast at the 3-star hotel in Fisterra, followed by the day's segment and accommodation in a hotel in Muxía.

DAY 6: MUXÍA

Breakfast at the hotel in Muxía.
